Position: Accompanist - Pacific Chorale Academy

Status: Part-time seasonal hourly employee

Reports to: Director of Education

Start Date: As needed, 2024 programs begin the second week of September.

Hours: The program takes place after school at multiple sites Monday

through Thursday between 2-6 p.m. Occasional evenings and weekends are required for concerts and field trips. Site assignments will be based on the candidate's availability and usually total 2-5 hours a week. Candidates do not need to be available for all 4 days. The program runs from September to May of each school

year.

Position Description

Pacific Chorale Academy is a unique after-school choir program which combines music education and socio-emotional learning, offered free to low-income students in grades 2-6. Resident Accompanists lead weekly rehearsals which focus on social connection, musical skills, and fun. PC Academy received a national award from Chorus America for its impact in neighborhoods that have limited access to arts enrichment opportunities.

Each 10-week residency uses a set of pre-developed lesson plans and recommended repertoire designed to teach healthy, age-appropriate vocal technique, musicianship skill, and cultural context. The program takes place after school at each site, and students join the program voluntarily.

The Accompanist is part of a two-person team with a Teaching Artist at each site.

Responsibilities

- Collaborate with PC Academy and partner faculty to foster an encouraging and joyful class environment where students are set up to succeed.
- Accompany rehearsals and performances for choirs of 20-40 students.
- Communicate effectively with students, site staff, parents, and the entire PC Academy team.
- Participate in regular planning meetings. All preparation time is paid.

Qualifications and Desired Traits

- Excellent keyboard and sightreading skills.
- Experience accompanying ensembles.
- Demonstrated excellent musicianship, creativity and artistry as a teacher/performer.
- Ability to prepare independently.
- Interest and ability to be a motivational mentor and role model for students, parents, and peers as an artist, teacher, and citizen.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills and the ability to work effectively with a wide range of constituencies in a diverse community.
- Spanish, Vietnamese, or other second language skills a plus.
- Flexibility and creativity to adapt to curriculum goals and ability to work collaboratively.
- Ability to work during program hours as well as additional hours for planning meetings, professional development, concerts, and field trips.

Requirements

- If hired, program staff are required to comply with Pacific Chorale's Child Safety Policy, which includes submitting fingerprints for a background check and providing proof of completed COVID vaccination.
 Tuberculosis screening may also be required for some sites.
- May be required to lift up to 25 pounds (such as boxes of music, chairs, music stands, etc.) either alone or with assistance.

Compensation and Benefits

\$40-\$50 per hour. All classroom and performance time, field trips, and meetings are compensated at the hourly rate.
